To be eligible for the support services and accommodations provided by the Disability Resource Center (DRC), you must have an identified disability as defined by the ADA/Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act. Disclosure of a disability is voluntary, and disability-related information is considered confidential and does not become part of your academic record.

HOW TO OBTAIN SUPPORT SERVICES AND ACCOMMODATIONS

1. For new Cabrini students, complete the DRC Support Services form available online at cabrini.edu/disability

Spring Semester Register by November 15th	\$800.00	Summer Session 2 Register by April 15th	\$350.00

2. Make copies of your most recent documentation by a licensed professional that states your disability as well as recommendations for accommodations.

DRC SERVICE OPTIONS

With documentation, ADA reasonable accommodations and services may include:

Testing in a distraction reduced room with extended time, access to audio books and other alternative formats of print materials, classroom lecture recordings, assistance with note taking, and more.

DRC SERVICES INCLUDED WITH TUITION:

- Intake registration meeting with the DRC Director/Assistant Director prior to the start of the first semester to review documentation.
- Provision of ADA accommodations letter for student to provide to instructors each semester. Student is primarily responsible for communication with instructors.
- Up to three 30-45-minute consultation meetings each semester with DRC Student Accessibility Specialist for self-advocacy skills, disability-related learning support and review of grades.
- Referrals made to Academic Enrichment for peer tutoring, writing and math support.
- Assistance with housing accommodations for DRC resident students, in collaboration with Residence Life.
- DRC homework/study room hours available during the semester.

IN ADDITION TO THE ABOVE SERVICES, THE ACCESS PLUS PROGRAM OFFERS MORE IN-DEPTH STUDENT SUPPORT.

Fee: \$800.00/semester (Fall/Spring)

\$350/semester (Summer 1/Summer 2)

- Opportunity for subsequent family meetings during the semester to review student progress/concerns.
- DRC Student Accessibility Specialist facilitates communication with instructors and monitors academic progress.
- Up to twenty-five 30-minute consultation meetings each semester with DRC Student Accessibility Specialist to offer additional academic support and executive function skill development.
- Weekly DRC drop-in access to receive professional tutoring in writing and math.
- Additional assistance with transition/mentoring offered by both DRC staff and DRC Honor Society Peer Mentors.
- Additional peer mentor support provided during homework/study room hours.
