

**Regulation**

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AT RISK STUDENTS

Assessment

- A. School district personnel will use a variety of tests and/or assessments to determine if a student should be categorized as at risk of not meeting the proficiencies of the New Jersey Core Curriculum Content Standards.
- B. Information regarding the district's assessment program, along with interpretive materials, will be released to the public as required by rules of the State Board of Education.

Academic Achievement Program Grades 9-12

- A. Academically at students are identified by NJASK, HSPA scores, and local standardized test scores.
- B. The enrollment in preventive and remedial programs shall be required for students at risk who do not meet New Jersey Curriculum Standards Assessments.
- C. Evaluation of the progress of students toward proficiency in meeting the New Jersey Core Curriculum Content Standards.
- D. Evaluation of the effectiveness of the district at risk program, in terms of student gains and other relevant factors is done annually.
- E. A detailed budget for the administration, personnel, supplies, equipment and training of staff through professional development is developed annually.
- F. Both the student and the student's parents/guardians will be notified of the student's need for remedial programs. Notification will be made in writing in the language or mode of communication that is understood by the student and the parents/guardians.
- G. Continuing communication between teaching staff members and the parents/guardians of students receiving remedial programs is ongoing.
- H. Evaluation and remediation of students who demonstrate deficiencies at the end of the eleventh grade and during the twelfth grade will be conducted.
- I. Programs and services may be offered during the regular school day and beyond the school day.
- J. The board shall provide training for the staff necessary to implement the programs and services for students at risk.
